3. BIRDWATCHING DEVELOPMENT IN THE SOUTHERN BENIN



ECO-BENIN and Cybelle Planète have just launched a mission of ecovolunteering to set up a birdwatching circuit around the Toho Lake in the Southern Benin. Indeed, the potential of development offered by the activity of birdwatching is still unknown and unexploited by local communities in Benin. It is to establish a birdwatching demonstration site that ECO-BENIN has chosen certain sites of the Mono valley where these water birds are more common but threatened through trappings of birds and massive pickup of eggs notably around the TOHO Lake. During this mission, identification and the censuring of birds around the lake and peripheral sites are the main tasks that ecovolunteers will have to lead. The work will consist in helping a team of ECO-BENIN and the riparian fishers (local guides) who already have an experience in this kind of activities to identify and count birds of wetlands areas. Censuses will be associated to activities of sensitization and animation on the protection of birds in schools and villages where ECO-BENIN is establishing a club of bird friends. Lasting 15 days in the field, ecovolunteers are going to contribute to the setting up of birdwatching circuits as a support to ecodevelopment effort in Benin. 4. ROUNDTABLE ON ECOTOURISM DEVELOPMENT IN BENIN



Benin Ecotourism Concern (ECO-BENIN NGO) is collaborating with the local NGOs, Community-Based Organisations (CBOs), tourism operators, and other conservation organisms to hold a Roundtable on Ecotourism in Benin. As an associated event of the 2007 World Tourism Day, this Roundtable discussion will occur in Benin. The chief aim of this Roundtable is to bring important issues of Ecotourism development for environmental protection in Benin and to generate issues. This will be accomplished through building partnerships, sharing concerns and defining priority needs associated with the development of Ecotourism. The Roundtable is designed to help meet the Benin Ecotourism Concern objectives by generating technical input and developing recommendations for ecotourism development. This event will therefore differ somewhat from previous workshop exercises in Benin in that it will be designed a strategic

action plan with a monitoring plan for Ecotourism and e-tourism development in Benin, and will have a more explicit focus on building new partnerships and new mechanisms for cooperation, within Benin and foreign ecotourism and e-tourism organizations. The Roundtable will bring together experts from the International Ecotourism Society (TIES), regional and local partners who have a high degree in ecotourism planning and management.
